Teacher Job Description

Responsibilities

- Relate to students by loving them with the love of Christ, encouraging them to begin and/or develop a relationship with God through Christ, and challenging them to love God with all their hearts, minds, souls and strengths.
- Be a role model of Christian love, faith, truthfulness, and virtue, both in the classroom and in your personal life.
- Manage the class by setting clear expectations of behavior, establishing reasonable routines and promoting self-discipline based on Biblical principles.
- Teach students in a challenging, enthusiastic and age-appropriate manner using the classical Christian model. Ensure that within the year, the scope and sequence of skills assigned to the grade/subject are taught to the students.
- Apply biblical principles and comply with school policy in administration of behavioral discipline in the classroom. Communicate clearly, frequently and regularly to parents about discipline issues regarding their children.
- Evaluate each student's progress on a regular basis and communicate this progress to the student, parents, and Principal.
- Assist the Curriculum Committee with curriculum selection and development to fulfill the distinctives of the classical Christian model.
- Respond expediently to parent, student, or volunteer concerns and ideas.
- Assure the facility and equipment of the classroom are safe and well maintained.
- Serve as an advocate for classical Christian education in the Greenville community.
- Stay current on the best practices in education and teaching, particularly within classical Christian education, in order to provide educational excellence
- Actively involve parents in the life of the school, and coordinate classroom volunteers and the parent/teacher fellowship.

Qualifications

Candidates for faculty positions at Greenville Classical Academy must:

- Exemplify and articulate a saving and growing relationship with Christ. Be a person of Christian love, faith, truthfulness and virtue.
- Be active in a local church, with a substantial record of service and leadership in the body of Christ.
- Read Douglas Wilson's book, *Recovering the Lost Tools of Learning*, and be in agreement with its major premises.
- Demonstrate a willingness to be trained in classical Christian educational methods.
- Be in agreement with the Greenville Classical Academy Vision, Philosophy, and Statement of Faith.
- Be passionate about educating children in a Christian environment, and about the grade/subject to be taught. Experience is preferred but not required.
- Be willing to work closely with parents in the education of their children.
- Be committed to academic excellence.
- Be committed to personal life-long learning.
- Possess Bachelor's degree.
- Must agree to attend (at the school's expense) an ACCS or ACCS-endorsed conference within two years of being hired and at least once every three years following.
